

LEAGUE OF INNOVATIVE SCHOOLS: STATEMENT ON DIGITAL EQUITY

CONNECT KIDS NOW!

In a day and age when logging into the internet is as ubiquitous as turning on the electricity, why are up to 30 percent of our students in the dark?

In mid-March, as thousands of school districts across the country began to close their physical doors and transition to emergency digital learning, 15 million students were suddenly adrift without devices and access to the internet—and families were face-to-face, yet again, with the stark inequalities in education.

Digital learning is a reality for K-12 districts today and beyond. Technology devices and internet access are essential. Student access to high-quality online learning—to view educational videos, work on learning activities, engage with teachers and connect with peers—is a must-have.

It is simply unacceptable for low-income students to not have devices and internet access.

As members of the Digital Promise League of Innovative Schools, we have been implementers of and advocates for equitable access to technologies to close the Digital Learning Gap since our inception in 2011.

We are well-versed in the technology systems, structures, and supports that are required to ensure ALL children—particularly our most vulnerable—are technically equipped to navigate, succeed, and thrive in an increasingly digital world. Yet, even our districts that serve high-poverty populations struggle with providing access to 100 percent of their students. It should not be the responsibility of school districts to ensure families are equipped at home.

As a collective, we are advocating for:

- Students and families to have home internet access as a fundamental right
- Special fund to support districts to provide a learning device for every student
- E-Rate to be expanded to include home internet access
- Special fund to coach teachers on effective, engaging, and authentic digital learning experiences, and to coach families on device management and continuity of learning
- A national movement to advocate for policies and legislative actions to ensure the sustainability of access throughout a child's K-12 learning experience

We cannot stand by and watch our underserved populations continue to bear the burden of neglect.
