LESSON PLAN:		
Objective(s)	Examine hunger and nutrition on a local and global scale. Analyze the stories of people who are working to en world hunger and malnutrition. Plan your own community garden using healthy and sustainable gardening methods.	
<b>Essential Questions</b>	How can we eliminate hunger and malnutrition?	
Teach Lesson/ Model	Students will learn examine hunger and malnutrition on a global scale utilizing the Transforming our World: Zero Hunger interactive Nearpod. Student will read through articles and websites about what people and organizations around the world are doing to combat hunger. Students will then research their own community and determine which local organizations and people are working on to help fight hunger. For their final assessment students will research and design their own sustainable community garden.	
Guided Practice	Students will be guided through the interactive Nearpod lecture by the teacher. There will be activities, collaboration and checks for understanding imbedded into the lecture.	

Independent Practice	Students will research local community projects that are fighting world hunger. They will then research community gardens and design and develop plans for their own gardens.
Closure	Students will answer and open-ended question on how they would teach someone else about what they learned in today's lesson. Also, they will be completing a short poll on how much they understand about helping end world hunger.
